The Victorians

<p>Reading</p> <p>We shall be continuing and developing our understanding of the Victorian Era whilst reading various non fiction texts and a fiction book called Street Child. We will also read Oliver Twist alongside our English lessons.</p> 	<p>Writing</p> <p>In English lessons, we will be conveying the misery and hopelessness of the workhouse through a description of the communal dining hall in Oliver Twist. We will be analysing and making careful vocabulary choices to portray a certain atmosphere as we write our final descriptions in the style of a short narrative.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>This half term we will work on place value of numbers up to 10,000,000. We will also further develop our addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills and apply these to multi-step word problems.</p>
<p>History</p> <p>This half term, we will be learning about key events during the Victorian Era which resulted in significant turning points in British history. We will explore one of Queen Victoria's houses (Osborne House) during our residential to the Isle of Wight.</p>	<p>PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education)</p> <p>This half term the theme is 'Healthy Relationships.' This will involve discussing challenges that arise from friendships and suggesting assertive behaviours and reactions when overcoming these within a group dynamic.</p>	<p>Computing</p> <p>This half term, we will be exploring the concept of variables in programming through games in Scratch. We will identify what variables are and relate them to real-world examples of values that can be set and changed. We will apply our knowledge of variables and design to create and improve our own games in Scratch.</p>
<p>French</p> <p>In French we will be learning vocabulary related to 'The Date'. We will be able to ask how what the date is and read the days of the week, months and numbers up to 31.</p>	<p>Games and PE</p> <p>In Games we will be developing our skills of dribbling and team work through playing football. This half term we will develop our problem solving and navigation skills through orienteering in PE.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>This half term we will be learning how light behaves. We shall investigate this whilst looking at shadows and what happens when light hits certain materials.</p>
<p>RE (Religious Education)</p> <p>Our concept in RE is rites of passage; we will explore what rites of passage are, focusing on Christian baptisms and humanist naming ceremony.</p>
